

#### **MISSION STATEMENT**

American Friends of the Hebrew University (AFHU) is a national, not-for-profit 501(c) (3) organization with offices throughout the United States. AFHU's mission is to raise funds for, and increase awareness of, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem (HU), expanding support for Israel's leading institution of higher learning and research.

AFHU spearheads programs, events, educational forums, fundraising activities, and missions to Israel in support of the Hebrew University community, which comprises 1,000 faculty and approximately 23,000 students annually. Forging a meaningful partnership between the American people and Israel's people, AFHU helps to ensure Israel's continued strength and pre-eminence nationally and internationally.

AFHU-sponsored cultural, educational, and social programming attracts people from all walks of life, including Hebrew University and Rothberg International School alumni, American scholars and scientists, and the general U.S. public. Initiatives promote

greater understanding of the University's contributions to the world in fields ranging from nanotechnology to sustainable agriculture, medicine and the humanities. Founded by American philanthropist Felix M. Warburg in 1925, AFHU has been a central force in the Hebrew University of Jerusalem's rise to global prominence. Today, AFHU is part of an international network of Friends organizations spanning more than 25 countries.






# **RESEARCH**

The Hebrew University of Jerusalem is rated as one of the world's top 100 universities, with eight Nobel Prize winners among its faculty and alumni and 10,000+ patents awarded to its researchers.



































# **SCHOLARSHIPS**

# \$11.2 million to support scholarships and financial aid.

Scholarships and financial aid for promising students are an investment in Israel's future. A recent report, produced by the University in conjunction with Social Finance Israel (SFI), provides some interesting insights: students report that financial aid helps them academically, and alumni state that financial aid allowed them to graduate sooner, enabling them to become productive workers. Figures show a four-fold return on investment from scholarships and financial support based on the value to recipients, increased tax receipts, and growth in Israel's GDP.

## **SPECIAL PROJECTS**

# \$13.8 million for special projects and general support

Unforeseeable circumstances occur—HU welcoming and supporting Ukrainian refugee faculty and students, for example—and opportunities arise which require funding from the University. These special projects, while small in comparison to other priorities, are important in their own right.

General support gifts provide the flexibility AFHU needs to conduct its fundraising efforts and promote the important work taking place at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.
