Professor Tomer Broude is Dean of the Faculty of Law at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, where he holds the Bessie and Michael Greenblatt, Q.C., Chair in Public and International Law. Professor Broude's scholarship and teaching are in public international law and international economic law, particularly international trade and investment, human rights, dispute settlement, development and cultural diversity, and the behavioral economics of international law.

He is the author and editor of several books, as well as numerous articles that have appeared in leading academic journals such as *International Organization*, *University of Pennsylvania Law Review*, *European Journal of International Law*, *Leiden Journal of International Law*, *Vanderbilt Law Review*, *Virginia Journal of International Law*, *International Journal of Cultural Property*, *Journal of World Trade*, *World Trade Review*, and the *Journal of International Economic Law*. He is an Editor of the *Journal of International Dispute Settlement* and a General Editor of the Cambridge University Press book series on International and Economic Law (CITEL).

He is one of the founders of the Society of International Economic Law, and a former member of its Executive Council. Professor Broude serves on the WTO's indicative list of dispute settlement panelists; the list of Israeli arbitrators under the Israel-MERCOSUR Free Trade Agreement; and Chapter 10 of the Canada-US-Mexico Agreement (formerly Chapter 19 of the North American Free Trade Agreement). He is a Member of the Advisory Committee under Israel's Trade Remedies Law.

He has taught at numerous law schools around the world, including the University of Toronto, the University of Virginia, the University of California-Los Angeles, Fordham Law School, Hong Kong University, McGill University, Melbourne Law School, the University of British Columbia, and Gujarat National Law University. Recently, he was a distinguished fellow at the Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy at the University of Toronto (2020-2022) and a fellow at the Berlin-based research group "The International Rule of Law – Rise or Decline?"
